

Chartered in November 2010, the club is open to The Villages residents with an interest in vehicles more than 25 years old.



Living in Florida we're lucky in that we have pretty good "cruising" weather all year long. And while we have more of an opportunity to enjoy our rides than some of our northern friends, the spring right through to the fall can bring some awful hot weather. Street rods and cruisers on the whole, all seem to share a common trait. They run hot. After packing in A/C, tranny coolers, and a bunch of horsepower, invariably it becomes a battle to cool the beast. But if you think more antifreeze/coolant is the answer, check this out. Straight water in your radiator will actually conduct 60% more heat than a 50:50 mix of water and antifreeze/coolant. I've known guys that simply keep adding antifreeze/coolant to their system each time it needs topping off. In which case they may actually be adding to the problem instead of helping solve it. Of course straight water does not offer your radiator, water pump and engine block the corrosion protection (and in the case of the water pump, lubrication) that the antifreeze/coolant will. However, reducing the antifreeze/coolant content of your system down to say 15 percent should increase heat transfer greatly - in some cases it could result in your engine running up to 12 degrees cooler. If your ride is pushing the 200 degree mark a 12 degree drop should be a welcome sight on your temp gauge. Of course there are also products that you can buy which can be added to your cooling system that will not only drop your running temps lower but also offer

corrosion protection and lubrication as well. One final note: if you plan a rod run to New York in December the 50:50 mix of antifreeze/coolant will need to be replenished. But for the most part in sunny Florida who needs antifreeze???
